CULTIVATING THE WEED OF COMMUNISM OPPOSING ELEMENTS CONTRIBUTING TO THE SAME END

THE QUIETLY working Communists in America are not accomplishing their ends as easily as they had hoped to do, for they are meeting intelligent resistance wherever they make their presence felt to any great extent. Opposition, however, does not discourage the Communist gentry. Their kind thrive on resistance. The agitating Communists work adroitly, according to carefully prepared plans. Whenever men labor collectively the Communists seek "employment" in order to sow their seeds of industrial revolution and political treason.

The American Trade Unions have furnished the Communists one of their means of essential contact with the American worker. Their growing influence in the ranks of organized labor has caused leaders in the American Labor Federation to take necessary action against Communism, within their organization. Facts indicate that American trade unionism is so seriously threatened from communistic influence, that a group of trade unionists recently organized a committee to plan an effective campaign against the communistic members of the American unions. To begin with, this committee has issued a call to all trade unions in New York City and vicinity to attend a general conference "to consider plans for the elimination of Communists from the American labor movement."
