THE FINANCIAL SITUATION.

The situation of the national finance I s very grave. The Republican house has passed measures to relieve the CORPORATION PROPERTY REDUCED treasury, a tariff bill and a bond bill. It is probable that under the circumstances the president will approve both, if the senate passes them. If the agnate does not pass them, the president will sell bonds under present legislation to a syndicate. If the sepate gets into a serious controversy over the measures for financial relief, a general paule may be precipitated. It is to be hoped this will be avoided The country has had all it can stand of this sort of thing.

If the president's extrems golds andard policy is carried out-and having entered thereupon there is for him no way out of it-this legislation and gold bond issues are indispensible In the opinion of many, if the credit of the country is to be maintained. It is unfortunate that the policy of redeem ing coin notes, greenbacks and silver certificates in gold only was ever a lopted. This poticy will, if adhered to, compell the government to put up a dollar in gold for every dollar or paper and silver in circulation, and perhaps for the nickels and coppers. It is a fatal policy, but having begun i there is no retreat likely nuder Cieve

The goldholders and boadholders have the country in their pocket and the problem must work itself out, I. the face of an increasing deficit, a probable panic, and a depreciated curreacy, the majority of the Republicanin congress seem to have decided to maintain the national honor and credit by passing the bills that seem to them to meet the emergency. The senate will probably do the same. But the relief will only be temporary. Perma nent relief will not come until the revenue tariff and exclusive gold standard are abandoned. This, the Republican party will, we trust, wisely bring about in 1896 and 1897. But there is a dark year ahead of the the country. We believe it would be better for the national treasury and all the banks if they would recognize the silver dollar as a legal tender dollar: it would relieve the situation very much Now, whatever is deposited in banks, buit silver or paper, becomes finally a demand in gold.
